As such, we have worked for 40 years with United Farm Workers (UFW) and our other farm worker partners, representing the voice of thousands of people of faith who are actively seeking economic and racial justice for farm workers.

	Mushroom workers at Windmill Farms in Sunnyside, Washington are demanding a workplace free from threats, excessive pressure, harassment and retaliation. The workers have democratically elected a committee to represent them and are organizing with United Farm Workers, yet their management refuses to meet with them.
<i>Farm Worker</i> <i>Ministry Northwest</i> is a member organization of National Farm Worker Ministry	After three years of trying to better their working conditions, United Farm Workers has called for a boycott of Windmill Farms mushroom products. Farm Worker Ministry Northwest, National Farm Worker Ministry, Washington Education Association, and other organizations have endorsed the boycott and are publicizing it with their constitutents.
	We urge Safeway to honor the boycott and not buy Windmill Farms mushrooms.
	Please participate with us in justice for farm workers. Our farm workers are truly essential workers and deserve to be protected by labor laws that other workers enjoy. They deserve to earn a living wage, and have safe and just working conditions.
